Who Spends the Money You Donate to the Annual Fund?

Answer – you and other Rotarians. In short, only Rotarians decide how to use the money. When you donate to the Annual Fund, half the money comes back to District 6000 three days later to be used for our Rotary Clubs, Global Grants, and Global Scholarships. The rest remains for The Rotary Foundation to provide matching funds for Global Grants. No charity or other organizations can apply to use Rotary Foundation for funds. No board of trustees looks at the money and decides how to distribute it. Gifts to the Annual Fund, also known as SHARE, are the primary source of funding for a broad range of local and international grants that change lives. We thank you for the support that you provide for a District Grant this year! The Rotary Club of Moultrie shares in this newsletter about its grant that helped a local elementary school. How has your club made a difference in your community through this year's Annual Fund? What will be a District Grant for you this year?
