On April 91, the Rotary Club of north Cobb collaborated with the Rotary Club of Winder and its President Al Darby, as well as other Barrow area Rotary Clubs to celebrate the 25th anniversary of Apalachee High School by planting a Peace Pole in front of the school. This was followed by a sumptuous barbecue for over 250 staff, students, first responders, supporters and community members.

The Peace Pole was created by the students of Devereaux Advanced Behavioral Center (some of the most vulnerable children in our community). Its message - "May Peace Prevail on Earth".- was translated to the Cherokee language and Spanish, in addition to its English version.
